## Instructions

#### Charging

The bell boot has a built-in battery that may be charged with the included USB > Type-C cable.

Charge the device for 2 hours. The device has a battery life of up to 1 hour of continuous use (or 4 applications).

If the lights begin to dim, it's time to charge.

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# Application

- Wrap the boot over the pastern/coronary band area, as you would a regular bell boot.
- You may also use it over the knee, hock, or poll.
- Wrap snugly so that the LEDs are pressed against the skin for maximum efficacy.
- This boot is not meant to be used as an overreach boot or protective boot - it is a therapy device meant to be used in crossties or in the stall.



## Usage

- Press the power button once to activate all wavelengths.
- Press the power button twice to activate red light (660nm) only.
- Press the power button three times to activate near infrared light (850nm) only. This setting will not produce visible light as NIR light is invisible to the human eye.
- Press the power button one more time until the green light turns off. The device has powered off.
- Hold the power button for 3 seconds to activate the pulsing mode. The button will turn blue, then you can cycle through the settings again.

# Usage Guidelines

- Never use over a cancerous growth.
- Do not use on recent burns.
- Do not use on an open or bleeding wound.
- Consult a veterinarian before use on lame, ill, pregnant, senior, or young horses.
